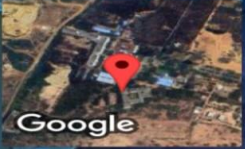
3.5. Conclusion and Vote of Thanks:

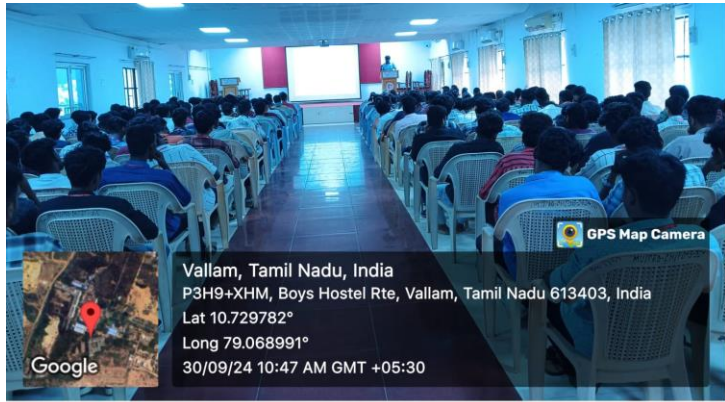
4. Outcomes:
