The new members have assured their full support for all the activities of IQAC that enhances the quality.

**PART - A GENERAL**

**Item 91.1: To confirm the minutes of the 90<sup>th</sup> meeting of the IQAC held on 27.07.2018**

The minutes of the 90<sup>th</sup> meeting of the IQAC was circulated to all the members through mail and confirmed since there was no remark / correction received.

**Item 91.2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on decisions of the previous meeting**

**Part -B: REVIEW OF PROGRESS OF ACTIVITIES - NAAC CRITERION WISE**

**Item 91.3: Criterion I - Curricular Aspects**

- **Programmes/ courses focused on employability/ entrepreneurship/ skill development**

95 courses focusing on employability / skill development were introduced during July 2018 to September 2018. The details are attached as Annexure I.

- **Academic Flexibility - New programmes/courses introduced**

It was informed by Dean (Academic) that 30 new courses were introduced during July 2018 - Sept 2018. The details are attached as Annexure II.

24 students have registered for NPTEL Online courses and 22 students for Coursera. Members have suggested to increase the number by motivating the students.

- **Curriculum Enrichment**

The number of students undergoing various Value Added Courses offered by different departments was listed out.

It was suggested that the percentage of students opting for Value Added Courses has to be identified and analyzed on the basis of gender, economic background of the students and number of arrears, etc.

One of the members raised that why the number of students attending SPSS is very less (4 students). Dean Academic answered that it is a mandatory course for management students and a Value Added Course for M. Phil students and hence the 4 students opted for SPSS belong to M.Phil.

Further, it was suggested by a member, to carry out study (by the Department of Management Studies) for attracting more students for Value added Courses.

- **Feedback**

The analysis of the feedback on curricular aspects obtained from the Alumni during the Convocation 2018 is in progress. The points shall be presented in the next IQAC meeting.

**Item 91.4: Criteria - II - Teaching Learning and Evaluation**

- **Admission statistics**

A report on Admission 2018-19 which includes students from other states and countries and demand ratio, was presented by the convener Dr. K. Lakshmi.

Mr. V.Anburaj, Representing Board of Management, suggested to identify the reasons for less number of admissions in some departments, percentage of conversion from prospect to full admission

and programmes for which applications were not accepted or no admission.

Prof. Dr. S. A. Dhanaraj asked about the three enquiries received for an UG programme, which could not be converted into admission.

It was suggested by the members to analyse the report and submit the inference for discussion.

*(The inference of the analysed report along with the suggestions for improvements is attached as Annexure-III).*

Dr. Margratte Annuncia suggested to conduct a research survey and collecting data from stakeholders using questionnaires. It was discussed and decided that the template for the questionnaire shall be framed referring few existing samples.

- **Evaluation Process and Reforms**

The grading system is revised with modified grade points in line with the UGC guidelines.

Regarding the minimum attendance requirement for Continuous Assessment exams, the matter needs to be placed again in the forthcoming Academic Council meeting with amended recommendations. However, it was accepted by all the members to fix the minimum attendance requirement for appearing for Summative Assessment (End Semester Examination) as 75%.

**Item 91.5: Criteria - III - Research, Consultancy and Extension**

- Dr.S.Kumaran, Dean / Research briefed the research activities of PMIST in the previous quarter and highlighted the outcome of the research coordination meeting held on 03.09.2018.
- Workshops/Seminars Conducted on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and Industry-Academia Innovative practices during July 2018 to Sept 2018 were presented. The details attached as Annexure - IV.
- Dr. Margarete Annuncia pointed out that series of workshops need to be conducted in phased manner to train both faculty and students on 'Research Article writing' and 'Proposal writing for funded projects' without plagiarism.
- The details of Patents published during this quarter were presented by Dean Research.

**Item 91.7: Criterion - V - Student Support and Progression**

Dr. CV. Subramanian has presented the summary report of Staff Development Programmes organized during the previous quarter and their outcomes. He has also highlighted the outcomes of the activities and programmes organized by CUIL, as detailed below:

- 223 students got placed in various companies with a highest package of Rs. 4.5 lakhs/annum with incentives, offered by M/S Kotak Life Insurance Co Ltd, Chennai for 72 students.
- All the pre final and final year students were given intense training on soft skill development, personality development and mock online

test. Further they were also exposed to various opportunities prevail for higher studies in abroad.

**Item 91.8: Criterion – VI -Governance, Leadership and Management**

Dr. A. George, Dean/ FHSM has presented the gist of the minutes of Academic Council meeting held on 15/09/18, highlighting the decisions made regarding the passing minimum requirement for FA and SA and Classification of degree for UG programme in Arts, Sciences, Humanities and Education, highlighting the following points:

- Foundation course for First year students was conducted from 09.07.18 - 24.07.2018
- The important decisions made in the 30th meeting of Academic Council which was held on 15.09.2018, are:
  - Amendment in the passing minimum requirement for Formative and Summative Assessment with minimum 40% in SA (includes Theory cum Lab) and 50% in total (overall) for all UG programmes in Engineering, Architecture and all PG programmes and minimum 35% in SA (includes Theory cum Lab) and 40% in total (overall) for all UG Arts, Sciences , Humanities and Education Programmes.
  - Amendment in the Classification of degree for UG programme in Arts, Sciences, Humanities and Education with no change in the norms of First Class with Distinction and First Class; For Second Class  $5.0 \leq \text{CGPA} < 6.0$ ; For Third Class less than 5.0.
- The details of teachers provided with financial support to attend conferences / workshops and towards membership fee of professional bodies are presented.

### **Item 91.10: Periyar Technology Business Incubator**

Prof. Dr. S. Devadoss, CEO, Periyar TBI has presented a detailed report of the activities of Periyar TBI during the last quarter and highlighted a few as follows:

- CEO Periyar TBI, Dean Academic and Dean Research held a series of discussions with few industries in connection with the Existing Incubation Centre (EIC) project under Atal Innovation Mission (AIM).
- Periyar TBI is short listed for grant in phase-2 in AIC/EIC. The CEO of PTBI attended a training program and had discussion with the team Atal Innovation Mission (AIM). Accordingly the Budget has been recast and sent for approval.
- M/S Scigen Research & Innovation, an incubate of Periyar TBI conducted a workshop on “Animal cell culture Techniques’ for students.
- Periyar TBI has submitted two skill development training proposals under DDU-GKY and TNSDC. The Regional Joint Director, TNSDC Trichy inspected the campus and the result is awaited.

- Scholarship, Tuition fees, hostel fees, bus fees to be fixed well in advance at least before November.
- First Come First scholarship scheme may be avoided; this gives uncertainty of scholarship availability. Due to this, students tend to move to other courses or colleges.

Senior Emeritus professor can be appointed for each department to improve teaching and learning and research.
