Item 101.1 Review if any and confirmation of the minutes of 100th meeting of IQAC held on 7.1.2022

The minutes of the 100th meeting of the IQAC conducted on 7.1.2022 was circulated to all the members through mail and confirmed as such since there was no remark/correction received.

Item 101.2 Review of Progress of Activities (Jan 2022 - Apr 2022) by IQAC and Criteria wise

a) Dr.R.Jayanthi, Director i/c IQAC presented the participation in Rankings by Institution and awarded rankings. Tamilnadu Green Champion award with Cash Award Rupees One Lakh from Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board, Government of Tamilnadu received by PMIST and was appreciated by the Members. The Programmes conducted a part of quality initiatives by IQAC has been briefed. The grant of workshop proposal submitted to NAAC by IQAC on title "Effective E-content Development for enhanced learning experience of students" was informed to the members.
